Directions

To reach us: follow I-95 North to Exit 157 Newport, Route 7 North to Dexter, Route 23 North to Sangerville, Route 15 North to Greenville. Continue straight through the yellow flashing light in Greenville on Lily Bay Road. Go 6½ miles to Black Point Rd (look for our sign on the left ½ mile past the marina). Turn left and stay on Black Point Road for 1½ miles to our camps (you will veer left at two intersections: North Ridge Rd and Cross Ridge Rd). Our camps are on the left and there is a sign at the top of our access road.

Located on the east shore of beautiful Moosehead Lake, we have been entertaining guests at our present location since 1905. We are only a 15 minute drive from Greenville which affords access to shops, services and restaurants. But when you are here, you will find it so quiet and serene you will think you have traveled to the end of the Earth.

Our Facilities

- ◆ We offer 6 housekeeping cabins, each with their own fully-equipped kitchen, bath with shower, gas heat, electricity, parking area, outdoor fireplace and picnic table. Linens and towels are provided.
- ◆ We have launching and docking facilities for guests. We have bait, tackle, maps, firewood, sporting licenses and registrations, and lots of free advice at the office.
- ◆ Canoe and kayak rentals are available onsite and remote mountain ponds offering excellent unspoiled fishing.
- ◆ Power boat rentals and gas are available at nearby Beaver Cove Marina.
- ◆ For snowmobile season, we have excellent access to ITS 86 and the Moosehead Trail.
- ◆ We provide starting point lodging for the best wilderness guide services in Maine. Enjoy wildlife viewing trips by vehicle or canoe, whitewater rafting trips on the Kennebec and Penobscot Rivers, and extended canoe trips on the famed Allagash and Penobscot River systems, as well as guided fishing and hunting parties. Registered Maine Guides are available onsite.

A Peek Into Our Cabins

Kit was built in 1904 using traditional French-Canadian vertical log construction. Sitting 20 feet above the shoreline, this cabin offers a fine view of the lake. Kit accommodates 2 people very comfortably.

Beaver was built in 1905 and sleeps up to 6 people. The main room has two twin beds and the bedroom consists of two twins and a set of bunk beds. You have a fantastic view of the lake, Burnt Jacket Mountain and Big Squaw Mountain.

Rainbow is a nice cabin for up to four people. Somewhat removed from other cabins, you'll be amazed at how peaceful it is here in Beaver Cove. You have a view of the lake and the mountains as you gaze from the backyard.

Brookie has been labeled our "honeymoon" cabin. The only cabin in the camps with a double bed, you will find its private setting to be just what honeymooners want. This cabin also provides you with a view of the lake and the mountains.

Laker and **Silversides**, built in 1985, can accommodate up to 10 people each. There are 2 bedrooms on the main floor: 3 twin beds in one while the other has 2 twins and a set of bunk beds. The loft has 2-3 twin beds. The cabins are located within 100 feet of the shoreline which you reach via our boat ramp.
